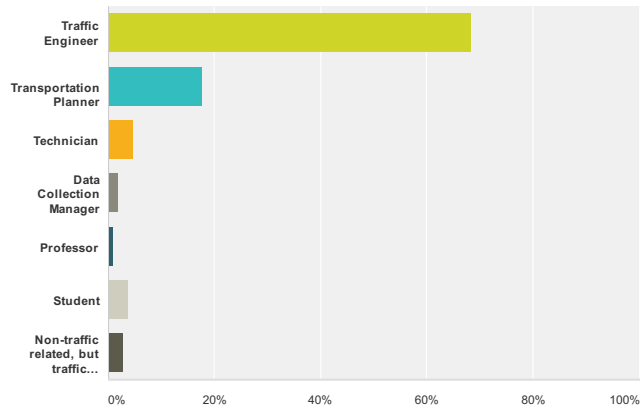


Q1 What is your profession?

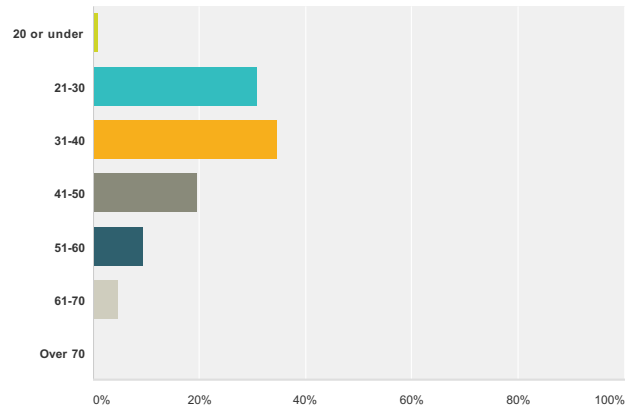

Q2 What is your age?

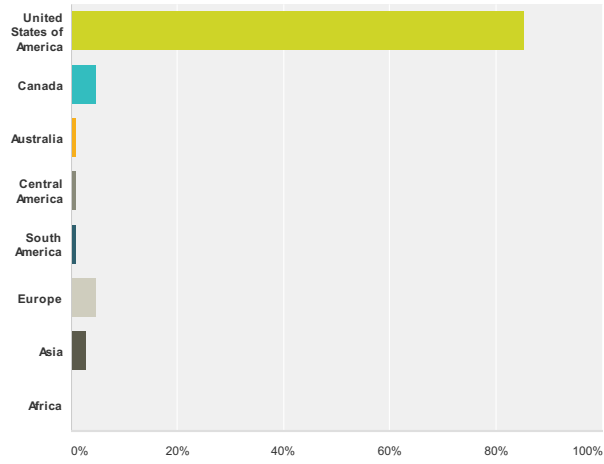

Q3 Where do you live?

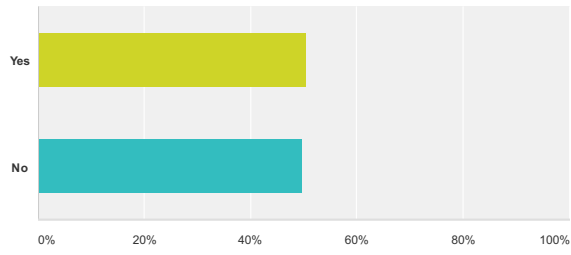

Q4 Are you a member of the Institute of Transportation Engineers?

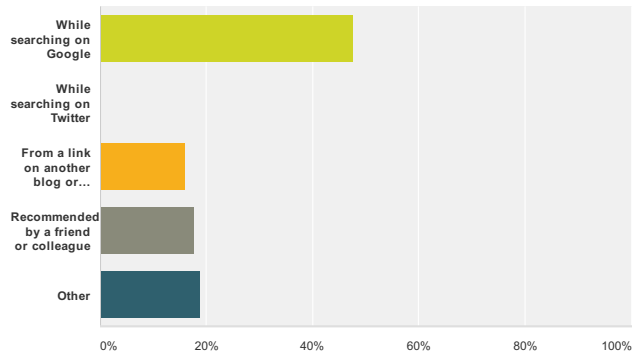

Q5 How did you find my blog?

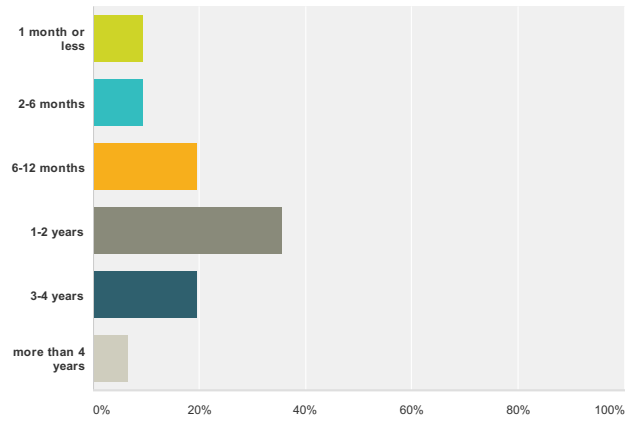

Q6 How long have you been reading my blog?

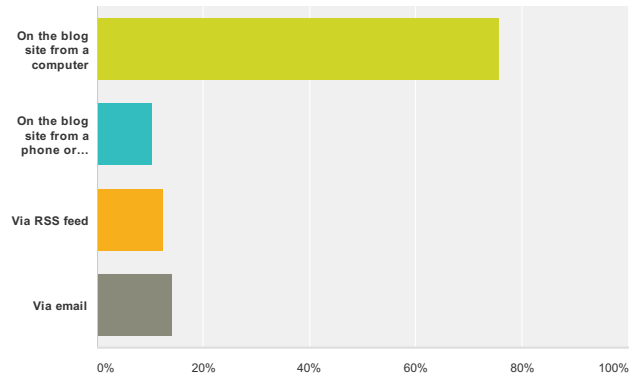

Q7 How do you read my blog?

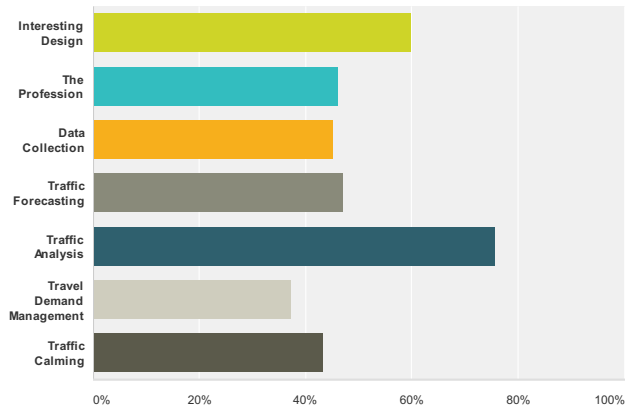

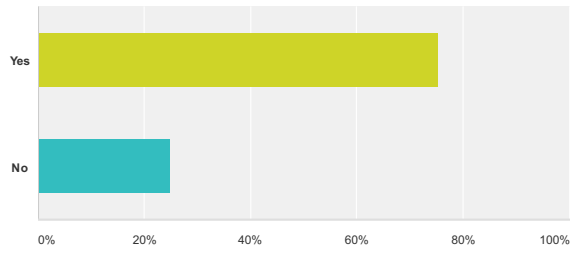
